Refrain: repeated after each verse of the ode:

'Ideesa Barbara / 'end a-rab a-mukhtarra / abooki hel-kafir / hel abad a-hejarra.

Ode:

St. Barbara, chosen by the Lord, your father that heathen, worships stones.
